SERVICE ADVANTAGES

LINEN LOSSES:

COMTEX has never charged customers for linen losses, but has provided guidance using on-site Customer Relations Specialists as well as outside experts to support linen utilization and control efforts. Historically, this has maintained linen damage and losses within acceptable ranges. COMTEX also tracks linen loss through monitoring of soil-to-clean ratio for each hospital.

MULTI-FACETED ENVIRONMENTAL TESTING:

COMTEX helped develop and continues to employ the Healthcare Laundry Accreditation Council (HLAC) Process Monitoring Program which tests for:

- Water
- Textiles
- Air
- Hard surfaces
- Employee hand hygiene



The HLAC toolkit more accurately identifies microorganisms contained on the top surface of linen and anywhere within the linen. Analysis will provide Total Aerobic Microbial Counts (TAMC), Total Yeast and Mold Counts (TYMC), and anaerobic spore forming bacteria such as *Clostridium difficile* (C. diff). Additionally, the toolkit helps the operator to isolate and identify potential problem areas that can become contaminated in between processes. *(continued on reverse)*

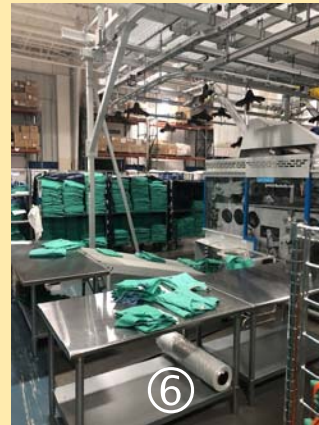

CONTAINER PURCHASING:

COMTEX purchases key textiles in container lots. This step provides a greater volume of product to be stored on-site to ensure complete fill ratios, but also enables the savings needed to help maintain lower costs to customers.

STAINLESS STEEL DELIVERY CARTS:

COMTEX delivery carts are specifically designed to be light weight, quiet and easy to maneuver. They are manufactured with non-marking wheels as well as non-marking bumpers. The most significant fact, however, is that stainless steel will not peel, rust or hold bacteria and since they resist scratches, it makes the cart ideal for a healthcare setting.



LOST & FOUND

Last month, 32 hospital equipment items were found in the soiled linen at COMTEX and returned to hospitals at no charge. These items were valued at \$85,200! Thus far, in our fiscal year the total is 205 items valued at \$455,500. Please check the beds when changing linen.



SHARPS

Being stuck by a sharp accidentally thrown in the linen soil bin is cause for concern for numerous reasons. Costs associated with a sharps injury can be a driving force to establish safer sharps awareness and policies. Along with expenses sustained by facility, the anxiety and helpless feelings experienced by the affected employee and family is massive. Coupled with the initial concern, testing for bloodborne pathogens can be extended for months, causing emotional distress for a prolonged period of time. Please remind all personnel to use proper disposal practices and STOP STICKS!
